## SPEAKERS AND WIPO OFFICIALS

## MI-CHUNG AHN

Dr. Mi-Chung Ahn, a national of the Republic of Korea, is at present a Deputy Director (Patent Examiner) of the Genetic Engineering Examination Division, Korean Intellectual Property Office (KIPO), and is in charge of patent examination of biotechnological inventions and of international affairs.

Dr. Ahn received her BS in Biochemistry from the Department of Biochemistry, Yonsei University, Korea in 1984, her MS from the Department of Microbiology and Immunology at the University of Illinois at Chicago, U.S.A. in 1988, and a Ph.D. from the Department of Immunology and Microbiology, Rush University, Chicago, U.S.A. in 1995.

Dr. Ahn's early career was as a Researcher at the Rush Medical Cancer Center in Chicago from 1988 to 1989. From 1995 to 1996, she worked on her Post-doctorate at the Biotechnology Analysis Division of the Korea Basic Research Institute, and from 1996 to 1997, at the Gene Therapy Unit of the Biotechnology Analysis Division, Korea Research Institute of Bioscience and Biotechnology. Ms. Ahn became the Deputy Director of the Ministry of Commerce, Industry, and Energy and was in charge of the Energy Conservation and the Efficiency Division and the Division for Biotechnology and Fine Chemicals which was involved in the promotion of Bio-industry, Research and development of Biotechnology, and International Cooperation.

In 1999, Ms. Ahn moved to the Korean Intellectual Property Office where she is presently Deputy Director (Patent Examiner) of the Genetic Engineering Examination Division.

In addition, Ms. Ahn is an affiliated professor of the Department of Life Science and Technology at the Pai-Chai University, Korea, and a Committee Member of the Presidential Commission on Sustainable Development (PCSD) of Korea.

## SAMTANI ANIL

Mr. Samtani Anil, a national of Singapore, is a Professor of Law in the Nanyang Technological University, Singapore. He has been admitted to the Roll of Advocates and Solicitors in Singapore and to the Roll of Solicitors in England and Wales. He specializes in the areas of electronic commerce law, information technology law, intellectual property law and international business law.

Mr. Samtani is a recipient of several awards and scholarships, the latest of which are: the 2001 US Fulbright Scholarship by the Fulbright Commission and the Centre for International Exchange of Scholars (CIES) for research in the field of intelligent software agents law (with particular emphasis on its application in the context of electronic commerce); visiting scholar to the Boalt Hall School of Law at the University of California at Berkeley (2001/2002). His past awards include the National University of Singapore and the Hokkien

Huan Kuay Foundation Scholarships, the Honda Motor Company's Japan IATSS Forum award and the Sindhi Merchants Association's Academic Excellence Award.

He has been engaged by the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) as an advisor and speaker on electronic commerce law, management and protection of intellectual property rights in the digital environment, and technical guidelines and best practices among ASEAN countries. He is listed in the roster of experts of the WIPO Worldwide Academy, and also currently sits on the panel of experts of the Washington-based International Law Institute. Mr. Samtani has also been appointed as the Chair of the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN)'s Membership Implementation Task Force for East Asia, and sits on the overall steering committee of ICANN's Membership Implementation Task Force. The Government of Thailand has invited him to be a special advisor on the role of technology in the new knowledge economy and the regulation of electronic commerce. The Government of the Philippines recently included him in the roster of experts of the Information Technology and E-Commerce Council. The Government of India has also invited him to be a board member of the fledgling Centre for E-Governance, a center that aims to be an interdisciplinary platform for the government, academics, multilateral agencies and interested persons to discuss relevant issues pertaining to electronic governance.

Mr. Samtani is currently an associate editor of the Information Technology Law Journal as well as the Asia Business Law Review. His present career includes the following: a member of the Japan-Singapore Privacy Working Group, the Japan-Singapore E-Commerce Law and Security Working Group and the Intellectual Property Office of Singapore's Committee on Intellectual Property Education and Awareness; works closely with the InfoComm Development Authority of Singapore (IDA) in formulating suitable initiatives pertaining to electronic commerce law, regulation and policy in Singapore. He is also a prolific writer whose articles have appeared in internationally referred law and business journals worldwide.

## TAKAO KATO

Mr. Takao Kato, a national of Japan, is presently the Director of the Office of Policy Planning and Promotion for Intellectual Property Management and Education Technology Research Division, General Affairs Department, Japan Patent Office. He obtained his Master's Degree in Nuclear Engineering from the Nagoya University in 1982.

Mr. Kato joined the Japan Patent Office in 1982. His career includes the following: he was Examiner in the Applied Physics Division, Second Examination Department in 1986; was a Consultant in the Cooperation for Development Bureau for Asia and the Pacific, World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) in 1991; Examiner in the Applied Physics Division, Second Examination Department from 1992 to 1996; Appeal Examiner of the 16<sup>th</sup> Board of Appeal (Business Machinery), Appeals Department in 1996; Senior Legal Officer of the PCT Legal Division in WIPO from 1997 to 2000; was back in the Japan Patent Office as Senior Examiner in the Material Analysis Division of the First Patent Examination Department (formerly the Second Examination Department); and from January 2000 to the present, he is incumbent Director of the Office of Policy Planning and Promotion for Intellectual Property Management and Education Technology Research Division, General Affairs Department.

## KHAW LAKE TEE

Professor Dr. Khaw Lake Tee is with the Faculty of Law of the University of Malaya, which she joined in 1982 as a lecturer. In 1991-92 and 1994-97, she held the position of Deputy Dean at the Faculty.

In December 1997, Professor Khaw was granted leave from the University to assist the Multimedia Development Corporation (MDC), a Government-owned company in charge of the overall development of the Multimedia Super Corridor (MSC), to assist MDC in the development of a legal framework for the MSC. In 2001, she was promoted to Vice President (Legal Advisor).

At the MDC, Professor Khaw's responsibilities included advising, developing and assisting the relevant government ministries and agencies on the policies and legal issues relating to cyberlaws and intellectual property laws as well as the development of a legal and regulatory framework in the fulfilment of the MSC Bill of Guarantees. Amongst other things, she was involved with discussions on the draft data protection law; the optical disc law as a means of containing the illegal reproduction of copyright works on optical discs; the formation of the content and consumer forums and the drafting of the respective content and consumer codes under the auspices of the Communications and Multimedia Act; the Steering and Technical Committees on the harmonization of laws with the cyberlaws; and the formulation of the IP Management Policy. Professor Khaw also represented the MDC in the eASEAN Legal Infrastructure Sub-Group established by the eASEAN Working Group on E-Commerce.

In August 2001, Professor Khaw was appointed to the Copyright Tribunal, a body set up under the Copyright Act 1987 to consider and decide on matters related to licensing schemes and the granting of licenses by licensing bodies.

Professor Khaw is the author of the book *Copyright Law in Malaysia* (2<sup>nd</sup> Ed) and the co-author of the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> editions of *Land Law in Malaysia*.

Professor Khaw holds an LL.B. (Hons) from University of Malaya, an LL.M. from Monash University and a Ph.D. from the London School of Economics, University of London. She is also an Advocate and Solicitor of the High Court of Malaya.

## JIN KIM

Mr. Jin Kim, a national of the Republic of Korea, is presently the Director General of the Information and Documentation Bureau, Korean Intellectual Property Office (KIPO).

He obtained his Bachelor's Degree in the English Language and Literature from Yongnam University and a Master's Degree in Business Administration from the American University, Washington, D.C., U.S.A..

Mr. Kim joined the Ministry of Commerce and Industry (MCI) in 1973 and held a number of senior executive positions such as a Secretary to the vice minister of MCI from 1973 to 1977; Deputy Director of International Trade Promotion Bureau from 1978 to 1987,

and in 1990, he was promoted to director of the Bureau. From 1991 to 1994, he served at the Korean Embassy in Jakarta, Indonesia as a Commercial Attaché.

Mr. Kim joined KIPO in 1996 as Director of the Planning Division, International Intellectual Property Training Institute (IIPTI) and was promoted to Deputy Director General of the International Cooperation Division in 1999. After serving as Deputy Director General of Trademark Examination Division (1) in 2000, he was appointed in 2001 as Director General of the Information and Documentation Bureau, the post he currently holds.

#### JONG-AN KIM

Mr. Jong-An Kim, a national of the Republic of Korea, is currently the Director of the Academic Affairs Division of the International Intellectual Property Training Institute (IIPTI).

Mr. Kim holds a law degree (LL.B.) from the Seoul National University, the Republic of Korea (1982) and a LL.M. from the University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia, U.S.A. (1990).

Before joining IIPTI in February 2002, he had worked as a Senior Program Officer of the Developing Countries (PCT) Division of the WIPO for three years. In 1981, he passed the Korean Senior Government Examination and worked for the Government of the Republic of Korea including the Korean Intellectual Property Office (KIPO). His experiences in KIPO includes Director of Planning and Budget Division, Administrative Director of Appellate Trial Board, Professor of IIPTI, Deputy Director of Intellectual Property Policy Division, Trademark Examiner and Deputy Director of IIPTI. He had also taught intellectual property law at many universities and gave regular lectures on the subject of trademark law and practice at the Graduate School of Intellectual Property and Law, Yonsei University and IIPTI.

He qualified as a Korean Patent and Trademark Attorney and passed the New York State Bar Examination in 1992.

#### JUNGKYUN KIM

Mr. Jungkyun Kim, a national of the Republic of Korea, is presently the Deputy Director of Academic Affairs Division, International Intellectual Property Training Institute (IIPTI), and is in charge of the International Affairs including 'WIPO Asian Regional Training Course for Trainers and Instructors of Intellectual Property'.

Mr. Kim obtained a Bachelor's Degree in Anthropology from the Department of Anthropology of the Seoul National University, Korea in 1997.

In 1997 he passed the Korean Senior Government Examination and has since worked for the Korean Intellectual Property Office (KIPO) where he worked at the Information Planning Division and the Industrial Property Protection Division. During his tenure as Deputy Director of Industrial Property Protection Division, he was in charge of anti-counterfeiting activities, staff training, and public awareness campaign.

## LI JIAHAO

Mr. Li Jiahao, a national of the People's Republic of China, is Deputy Director of the Cooperation for Development Bureau for Asia and the Pacific, WIPO, since December 1997. Before taking up his present duties, he held positions of Counsellor, Senior Program Officer and Senior Counsellor in the same Bureau. He joined WIPO in 1985.

Prior to joining WIPO, Mr. Li Jiahao was an official of the Chinese Patent Office (CPO), which has been renamed as the State Intellectual Property Office (SIPO), since April 1998. He studied and graduated from Sichuan University in Chengdu, and from the Postgraduate Institute of China Science and Technology University in Beijing.

## KOJI NOSHIMORI

Mr. Koji Noshimori, a national from Japan, is Patent Attorney since 1979. He obtained his Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering from Keio University in 1976.

Since 1976 he has worked in various organizations like the NOMA and Associates from 1976 to 1979; the Yuasa & Hara from 1979 to 1986; the Washington D.C. Branch of Pennie & Edmonds, under the supervision of the former CAFC Judge, Shiro Kashiwa, from 1987 to 1988; the Kamoda, Nishimori & Associates from 1988 to 1993; the Nishimori & Associates from 1993 to January 2000. From February 2000 to the present, he is one of the Partners of AOI International Patent Firm.

Mr. Nishimori held high positions in various organizations and associations. He was Vice Chairman of the Japan-US Practitioners Committee of the Japan Patent Attorney Association (JPAA); member of the JPAA Assembly; Vice-chairman of the Committee for Cooperation in Human Resources Development in the Developing Countries of JPAA; member of the Committee for Research on IP Rights in Foreign Countries of the Japan Institute of Invention and Innovation (JIII); Chairman of Overseas Cooperation Committee of the JPAA; member of the Committee for Human Resources Development Project in Asia and the Pacific Countries of JIII. He also has been a lecturer in the Patent System Seminar for Beginners and in Actual Procedures to the Japan Patent Office held by JIII.

## SUNAO SATO

Mr. Sunao Sato, a national of Japan, is at present Associate Officer in the Cooperation for Development Bureau for Asia and the Pacific, World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO). He is in-charge of industrial property-related activities under the Japan Funds-in-Trust Arrangement.

Before joining WIPO in May 1999, Mr. Sato was an official in the Japan Patent Office (JPO) in Tokyo where he held various posts. In 1993, he was a Trademark Examiner in the First Examination Department, and from 1995 to 1997, he became the Assistant Director of the International Affairs Division, the General Administrative Department. From 1997 to 1999, as a member of the Trademark Policy Planning Office, he was engaged in revising the Trademark Law of Japan. He also worked for the First International Organizations Division, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan (MOFA) from 1998 to 1999.

Mr. Sato holds a Bachelor of Arts degree, Major in Business Management from the Aoyama Gakuin University, Tokyo.

#### BONG-SIG SONG

Mr. Bong-Sig Song, a national of the Republic of Korea, is presently the Presiding Trial Judge of Industrial Property Tribunal, Korean Intellectual Property Office (KIPO).

He obtained his Bachelor's Degree from Korea Military Academy, a Master's Degree in Electronic Engineering from Yonsei University, Korea, and a Master's Degree in Industrial Engineering from the University of Illinois at Chicago, U.S.A..

Mr. Song served as a deputy director at the Ministry of Commerce and Industry from 1979 to 1991. He built up his professional career further working as a visiting researcher at the Ministry of International Trade and Industry in Japan for two years from 1991 to 1993, and as a director of the Presidential Committee of Science and Technology in Korea from 1996 to 1997.

He joined KIPO in 1997 as a director of the Semiconductor Examination Division 1. After working as a director general of the Examination Bureau 4 in 1998, he was appointed as the Presiding Trial Judge of Industrial Property Tribunal in 1999, the post he currently holds.

In addition, he is presently a professor of Korea Cyber University and a lecturer of Millennium e-CEO Academy, Graduate School of Business Administration, Korea University.

#### YIN XINTIAN

Mr. Yin Xintian, a national of China, is presently the Director General of the Legal Affairs Department of the State Intellectual Property Office (SIPO) of China. He graduated from the Qionggong University in 1977, majoring in automatic instrumentation, and from the Graduate School of Science and Technology University of China in 1981, majoring in digital signal processing, with Master's Degree awarded from the Science Academy of China.

Mr. Yin studied in the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office and in the German Patent Office as well as German Federal Patent Court, respectively, for six months. He also studied at the John Marshall Law School in Chicago for three months, and carried out research work in the Max Planck Institute of Germany for six months.

Mr. Yin was patent examiner of the Chinese Patent Office from 1982 to 1985; a member of the Board of Appeal of the Chinese Patent Office from 1985 to 1988; Chairman of the Technical Appeal Board on Physics from 1988 to 1994; Deputy Director General of the Patent Examination Administrative Department of the Chinese Patent Office from 1994 to 1998; and in 1988, he became the Director General of the Legal Affairs Department of SIPO, a post he holds up to the present.

He is the syndic of the Intellectual Property Research Association of China, professor of the Training Central of Intellectual Property of China, and legal advisor of the High Court of Shanghai City and the High Court of Fujian Province.

He represented SIPO in the second revision of the Patent Law and its Implementing Regulations, was in charge of its drafting work, and also took part in the revising procedure of the Law.

Mr. Yin is the author of the books titled *Protection of Patent Right*, published in 1998, and *The Explicit Explanation of the Newly Revised Chinese Patent Law*, published in 2001, and has also published more than 100 papers and articles on both domestic and foreign journals.
