Mr. DOWNEY of New York introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To prohibit the designation of countries as beneficiary developing countries under title V of the Trade Act of 1974 unless adequate protection is provided for United States trademarks.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 That section 502 of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2461)
4 is amended—

5 (1) by striking out “and” at the end of subsection
6 (b)(5);

7 (2) by striking out the period at the end of subsec-
8 tion (b)(6) and inserting in lieu thereof “; and”;

1 (3) by adding at the end of subsection (b) the
2 following:

3 “(7) if that country does not have adequate laws,
4 or fails to enforce effectively laws, prohibiting practices
5 by persons within the country that violate United
6 States trademarks, whether or not the trademarks are
7 licensed or otherwise recognized in that country.”; and
8 (4) by inserting at the end of the paragraph imme-
9 diately preceding subsection (c) the following new sen-
10 tence: “The President may not take any action under
11 this section with respect to a country under paragraph
12 (7) unless opportunity for public hearing on the matter
13 is made available after notice.”.
